We're proud to be running on solar at our Dundee branch

We worked with Boyd Jones to install a solar photovoltaic (PV) system on top of our Dundee location. This new system will reduce the branch's carbon footprint and generate an estimated 14,400 kilowatt-hours of electricity annually, or roughly the same amount of energy consumed by 16 Omaha households in an average month.

This was only our latest partnership in the quest to become more environmentally sustainable. Here's what else we've done:

- · Obtaining the first Powered Locally Certification from Bluestem Energy Solutions
- · Implementing a zero-waste initiative with Hillside Solutions
- · Working with Verdis Group to explore the reduction and offset of greenhouse gas emissions
- · Using an energy efficient, Earth friendly geothermal unit at the Dundee location
- · Creation of green spaces near their locations in Dundee and Blackstone
- · A zero-waste coffee bar and water dispenser to eliminate single use plastics

Dundee Community Garden News: Fresh Produce Donation Box

Our garden plots have never looked so well-tended as this summer, when vacations were scaled back, trips were canceled, and the public turned to gardening with a vengeance. Our members have plenty of produce growing in their plots, and our donation beds are producing loads of yellow squash, tomatoes, green beans, collards and kale, which we donate weekly across the street to the residents of the Underwood Tower.

Coming very soon (if not already here by time this newsletter reaches your mailbox) is a "Fresh Produce Donation Box" where donations of fresh produce can be dropped off and made available to anyone in the neighborhood. This box will be located in the Community Garden close to our "Little Free Library" along Underwood Ave., and operates in the same manner. When neighborhood gardeners find themselves with an excess of cucumbers, or a surfeit of tomatoes, you can drop them off in the donation box, and know that someone else will gladly take them! Likewise, our garden members can donate excess produce from their plots. We hope this will be an easy and convenient way to redistribute extra produce to those who can really use it, and make fresh produce more widely available to all our neighbors.

And while you're in the neighborhood, don't forget to check out what's growing in our "help yourself" Neighbor Garden area, right along Underwood Ave. We've got squash, beans, tomatoes, peppers, eggplant, and many herbs available for pick-your-own harvesting.





How to Freeze Tomatoes

Select firm, ripe tomatoes for freezing. Sort the tomatoes, discarding any that are spoiled.

Wet each tomato with water, rub its surface, rinse it with running water, and dry it with a paper towel.

After washing, cut away the stem scar and surrounding area and discard it before slicing or chopping the tomato.

If you prefer to freeze peeled tomatoes, you can wash the tomatoes and then dip them in boiling water for about 1 minute or until the skins split.

Place the tomatoes on cookie sheets and freeze.

Once frozen, transfer the tomatoes from the cookie sheets into freezer bags or other containers. Seal tightly.



Storage time

To extend the time frozen foods maintain good quality:

Package foods in material intended for freezing.

Keep the temperature of the freezer at 0 degrees Fahrenheit or below.

It is generally recommended frozen vegetables be eaten within about 8 months for best quality.

Najeeba Syeed is Associate Professor in Muslim and Interreligious Studies at Chicago Theological Seminary. She previously taught at Claremont School of Theology and founded its Center for Global Peacebuilding. Syeed is recognized as a leader in peacebuilding and social justice based research. Her articles have focused on faith-based conflict resolution, restorative justice, and intersectional analysis of state violence and structural racism. Most recently she co-edited the volume Critical Perspectives on Interreligious Education: Experiments in Empathy (Brill, 2020). In teaching, she has designed courses on interreligious education and interfaith leadership, dialogue, and peacebuilding. In community engagement, Syeed has received awards for her work reducing violence in schools and interracial gang conflicts, as well as being named the Southern California Mediation Association's "Peacemaker of the Year" in 2007. She has facilitated conflict resolution processes regarding school, community, environmental, and public controversies, and has provided training on theologies of peacemaking and nonviolent protest to dozens of organizations and faith based groups.

A sought-after writer and speaker, Prof. Syeed is a regular blogger for Muslim Voices, feminist.com, and Huffington Post and has been featured in publications and outlets including the Los Angeles Times, NPR, PBS, and the Tavis Smiley show.







